All of the proceeds went to our national philanthropy "The Ability Experience" and "True North." True North is an organization formed in the 1970's that aimed to serve rape survivors. Since their launch, they provide services for domestic and sexual violence victims as well. The goal of the organization is to "empower those who have been battered or abused by an intimate partner."

With around \$7,200 raised, we donated \$3,600 to both The Ability Experience and True North of Columbia. At Beta Epsilon, we pride ourselves in taking our philanthropy seriously. That's why when we heard the total dollar amount raised, we were all ecstatic at the money we had raised for these two great causes.
